### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Define Pasteurized Milk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: The term "Pasteurized Milk" shall apply to milk, every
2 portion of which, has been heated rapidly to a temperature
3 of not less than one hundred and forty-two degrees Fahren4 heit, nor more than one hundred and forty-five degrees
5 Fahrenheit, and held at such temperature for not less than
6 thirty minutes and then cooled immediately to a tempera7 ture of fifty degrees Fahrenheit, or less. Whoever by him8 self, his servant or agent, sells, exchanges or delivers, or
9 has in his custody or possession with intent to sell, exchange

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10 or deliver, any milk designated as "Pasteurized Milk" and 11 not conforming to the process and regulations as established 12 herein, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dol-13 lars for each offense. The commissioner of agriculture 14 shall, either in person or by his duly authorized agent, 15 diligently enforce this act.
