### STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Milo.

Resolved: That the sum of ninety-eight dollars and

- 2 eighty-five cents be appropriated for the year nineteen hun-
- 3 dred and twenty-nine to be paid to the town of Milo, to
- 4 reimburse said town for pauper supplies furnished in nine-
- 5 teen hundred and twenty-eight to Oscar J. Day and wife,
- 6 Tina M. Day and five minor children, as follows:

Albert Day, age 12 years.

Oscar Day, age 10 years.

Katherine Day, age 8 years.

James Day, age 9 years.

Georgie Day, age 6 years.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

That the said, Oscar J. Day applied to us for help February 2, 1928, giving his birthplace as Jacksonville, Maine, and his father's name as Burton Day.

That he left Jacksonville as a boy, that he has resided at Bar Harbor, Palmyra, Hartland, Bath, Manchester, N. H., and other places for a short time.

That we have mailed notices to these different places but they have refused settlement of this family.

Through injury and sickness we were forced to support this family and that we applied to the State Department but before the necessary papers could be prepared this family had removed to some place unknown to us and as far as we know this family has no settlement in the state of Maine.
