STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Rumford for Support of James Ouillette.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the town of Rumford, the sum of ninety-three 3 dollars and seventy-one cents, to reimburse said town for 4 money expended for support of James Ouillette.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve covers the amount paid by the town of Rumford for board and medicine for James Ouillette. His work was principally carried on in the woods and in several towns where he stayed for a very short length of time. The Overseers of Poor of Rumford have never been able to find that he had a legal pauper settlement anywhere in the State. His father died when he was twelve years old. The reason for falling in distress was that he never recovered from being badly poisoned four years before this aid was extended.
