STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Connor.

Resolved: That the sum of four hundred and fifty-nine
2 dollars and thirty cents be paid the town of Connor for
3 indebtedness incurred in the support of Joseph Pelletier, a
4 state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Sometime in the year 1927, Joseph Pelletier, otherwise known as Joe Pelkey, became sick and called on the town of Connor for help in order to have medical treatment. From that time until late in the fall of 1928 he was supported by said town. Late in the fall of 1928, after investigation by the town authorities and that of the state, he has been supported by the state of Maine, through the town of Caribou. As Pelletier is a state pauper, the town of Connor asks that it be reimbursed for the indebtedness incurred up to the time when he was taken over by the state. The town of Connor is to furnish vouchers for all money paid for the said Joseph Pelletier during said period
