STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Bethel for Support of David Sweetser and Family, State Paupers.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the town of Bethel, the sum of one hundred 3 ninety-eight dollars and fifty-five cents, to reimburse said 4 town for money expended for support of David Sweetser 5 and family, state paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

David Sweetser and family had assistance in the town of Bethel for nearly two years. They came into this State from New Hampshire, and returned to New Hampshire several months ago; in all probability they will not come to the State of Maine again. The family consisted of Mr. Sweetser, his wife, and eight children. Mrs. Sweetser is an Indian. The bills were questioned at the time the supplies were furnished, but inasmuch as the family has left the State and the Chairman of the Overseers of Poor of Bethel did as well as he could in the case, it seems only fair that the State should reimburse the town for these bills.
