STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Reed Plantation for Support of D. S. Farrar, a Person Having No Known Settlement in the State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to Reed Plantation, the sum of two thousand two 3 hundred four dollars and sixty-nine cents, to reimburse said 4 plantation for money expended for support of D. S. Farrar, 5 a person having no known settlement in the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

D. S. Farrar has been supported as a pauper in Reed Plantation since 1923. The assessors of the plantation have made every possible effort to fix the liability for his support and have been unable to prove that he had a pauper settlement in any city or town in the state. This plantation is not liable for his support and it is quite a hardship to be burdened with the expense. The assessors of the plantation, therefore, ask to be reimbursed by the state.
