STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

- AN ACT for the Better Protection of All Fur Bearing Animals in the Counties of Cumberland, Sagadahoc and Lincoln.
- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: There shall be a closed season for two years from the 2 passage of this act when it shall be unlawful in the coun-3 ties of Cumberland, Sagadahoc and Lincoln for anyone to 4 hunt, trap, pursue or kill or have in their possession, except 5 alive, any fur bearing animal (except bears, bobcats, loup-6 cervier or Canada lynx), or buy or sell or ship, or to at-7 tempt to ship from within said counties out of the state, 8 or into any other county of the state, either by mail, express,

9 automobile, truck, or in any other manner the skin, or any 10 part or parts thereof, of any fur bearing animal taken in 11 violation of this act.

This act shall not apply to the taking of foxes by means 2 of dog and gun from the first day of November to the fif-3 teenth day of January following, both days inclusive, nor 4 to the buying or selling or shipping out of the state or with-5 in the state the skins of foxes so taken with dog and gun.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall 2 pay a fine of twenty-five dollars and costs for each offense, 3 and in addition thereto, ten dollars for each fur bearing 4 animal hunted, trapped, killed, pursued, caught or had in 5 possession in violation hereof.

This act shall take effect when approved.
