#### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT for the Better Protection of Foxes in the counties of Cumberland, Sagadahoc and Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

There shall be a closed season of five years from the pas-

- 2 sage of this act when it shall be unlawful in the counties of
- 3 Cumberland, Sagadahoc and Lincoln, to set any trap or
- 4 traps for, or to catch in any manner, or to have in possession
- 5 either dead or alive any fox or foxes, or the skins or any
- 6 part thereof, or to buy or sell any skin or skins of foxes so
- 7 taken in traps, of any kind or description. Whoever vio-
- 8 lates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty

9 of not less than twenty-five dollars and costs for each of-10 fense, and ten dollars additional for each fox, or possession 11 of skin of any fox so trapped.

This act shall not apply to the taking of foxes with dogs 2 and gun from the first day of November to the fifteenth day 3 of January of the following year, both days inclusive.

This act to take effect when approved.
