STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Prohibit the Trapping of Muskrat in Sourdabscook Stream in the Town of Carmel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. It shall be unlawful for any person to trap 2 any muskrat or muskrats in Sourdabscook stream from the 3 point where the state highway crosses said stream in the 4 village of Carmel in the town of Carmel, to its junction 5 with the Penobscot river, or in any of the tributaries to said 6 stream between the two points hereintofore mentioned. It 7 shall also be unlawful during the same period for any per-8 son to have in possession at any time any muskrat or musk-9 rats, or any part or parts thereof, taken in any of the above-

10 named waters.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 pay a fine of ten dollars and costs for each offense, and in 3 addition thereto three dollars for each muskrat or part 4 thereof hunted, trapped, killed, pursued, caught or had in 5 possession in violation of any provision of this act.
