STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Protect Muskrats in the Towns of Greenwood,
Woodstock and Bethel, in the County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt,
2 trap, kill, pursue or catch any muskrat, or muskrats, in
3 Round pond and South pond in the town of Greenwood,
4 North pond in the towns of Greenwood and Woodstock
5 and Alder river in the towns of Greenwood and Bethel, all
6 in the county of Oxford, and also in all tributaries and out-
7 lets of said ponds and river.

Sect. 2. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have

2 in possession, at any time, any muskrat, or muskrats, or
3 part thereof, taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars and costs
3 for each offense, and three dollars additional for each musk-
4 rat or part thereof hunted, killed, trapped, pursued, caught,
5 or had in possession, in violation hereof.
