STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Prohibiting Interment, or Disinterment, of Bodies Without Permit, Amending Section Twenty-nine of Chapter Sixty-four of the Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:Sect. twenty-nine of chapter sixty-four, of the revised2 statutes be, and is hereby, amended by striking out all of3 said section, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 29. Except as provided in section twenty-four, no 2 interment, disinterment, or placing in a tomb, or vault, of 3 a dead human body shall be made without a permit, as 4 aforesaid, from the clerk of the town, or city, where said

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5 person died, or is buried; and no disposition of a dead 6 human body from any tomb, or vault, shall be made with-7 out a permit, as aforesaid, from the clerk of the town, or 8 city, where said body has been entombed, or placed in such 9 vault. No undertaker, or other person, shall assist in, as-10 sent to, or allow any such interment, or disinterment, to be 11 made, except as provided in section twenty-four until such 12 permit has been given, as aforesaid; and every undertaker, 13 or other person, having charge of any burial place, as afore-14 said, who shall receive such permit, shall preserve and for-15 ward the same to the clerk of the town in which burial 16 takes place within six days after the day of burial.'
