STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Park Commission of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

That section two of chapter two hundred and eight of the 2 private and special laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen 3 is amended by striking out the word "and" in the second 4 line of said section two and inserting after the word "Port-5 land" in the sixth line of said section two the words 'Baxter 6 Boulevard, Eastern Promenade, Western Promenade and 7 Bates Street,' so that said section two, as amended, shall 8 read as follows:

'Sect. 2. Said commissioners shall have charge and con-

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2 trol of the department of forestry, city playgrounds, of all 3 cemeteries (other than Evergreen cemetery), together with 4 parks, promenades, squares, and trees on public streets and 5 public grounds which are, or may be hereafter, reserved for 6 ornamental use belonging to the city of Portland, Baxter 7 Boulevard, Eastern Promenade, Western Promenade and 8 Bates Street, and under their directions all appropriations 9 made for said park and cemetery purposes shall be ex-10 pended for their proper care, including the extermination 11 of browntail and gypsy moths and other pests, also includ-12 ing other expenditures under the provisions of this act.'
