## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Harrison M.

Crocker of Whitefield.

Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be, 2 and hereby is, granted to Harrison M. Crocker, of White-3 field, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for 4 soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin 5 July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine and continue 6 until otherwise provided by the legislature.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Harrison M. Crocker is the son of the late Leonard Crocker, who served in Company H, 8th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. Mr. Crocker is 59 years of age and has been badly crippled from childhood. He receives a small government pension for his disability. He is now receiving state aid at \$10.00 per month under the general law, but this, with his government pension and the small amount that he and his wife can earn, is insufficient for their maintenance.
