STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Barbers Afflicted with Communicable
Diseases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person who is suffering from any communicable disease externally visible or not, such as trachoma, active tuberculosis of the lungs, open skin tuberculosis, syphilis, gonorrhoea, open external cancer, pediculosis and scabies, shall be an employee in or about any part of a shop or place of business for barbers or cosmetologists, within the state of Maine.

Sect. 2. No person who is suffering from any communi-

2 cable disease externally visible or not, such as trachoma,
3 active tuberculosis of the lungs, open skin tuberculosis,
4 syphilis, gonorrhoea, open external cancer, pediculosis and
5 scabies, shall be an employee in or about any part of a
6 public eating or drinking place or a bakery, confectionery
7 manufacturing sales room or any place where food products
8 are prepared or offered to the public, within the limits of
9 the state of Maine.

Sect. 3. Upon conviction, of either the employer or the
2 employee, of the above named offence, the convicted person
3 or persons shall each pay a fine of not to exceed ten dollars
4 and the costs of prosecution for a first offense and a fine
5 of not exceeding one hundred dollars and costs of prosecu-
6 tion for a second or subsequent offense and in addition
7 thereto the court may sentence such offender for a second
8 or subsequent offense to serve not more than thirty days'
9 imprisonment.
