IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-eight of Chapter Forty-five of the Revised Statutes, Relative to Canning of Short Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-eight of chapter forty-five of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "four
3 and three quarters" in the first and second lines of said
4 section and by inserting in place thereof the words 'three
5 and one half' and by inserting after the words "thirty-five"
6 in the third line of said section the words 'as amended,' so
7 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 38. *Canning of short lobsters prohibited; penalty for violation.* No person shall can lobsters less than three and one half inches in length, alive or dead, measured in accordance with section thirty-five as amended; and for every lobster canned contrary to the provisions of this section, every person, firm, association or corporation so canning shall be liable to a penalty of one dollar for every lobster so canned, and a further penalty of three hundred dollars for every day on which such unlawful canning is carried on.'
