STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred Seventeen of Chapter Seven of the Revised Statutes Relative to Military Parades on Election Days.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section one hundred seventeen of chapter seven of the
revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
"as described in section seventy-six of chapter fifteen, and
4 not thereby excepted," in the third and fourth lines of said
5 section, and by inserting in place thereof the words 'except
6 in cases of riot, invasion, or insurrection or imminent dan7 ger thereof, or of public danger resulting from flood, con-

8 flagration, or tempest,' so that said section as amended, shall 9 read as follows:

'Sect. 117. Penalty for military parades on election days. 2 Any officer of the militia who, except in time of war or 3 public danger, parades, his men, or exercises any military 4 command on a day of election, except in cases of riot, in-5 vasion, or insurrection, or imminent danger thereof, or of 6 public danger resulting from flood, conflagration, or tempest, 7 forfeits for each offense not less than ten nor more than 8 three hundred dollars.'
