STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Presque Isle Sewer District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section four of chapter eighty of the private and special
2 laws of nineteen hundred twenty-five is hereby amended
3 by striking out the first sentence in said section and insert-
4 ing in the place thereof the following:

'The annual meeting of the district shall be held in the
2 district on the first Monday of March in each year at such
3 hour and place as may be designated by resolution of the
4 board of trustees as provided in the by-laws,'

So that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'The annual meeting of the district shall be held in the
2 district on the first Monday of March in each year at such
3 hour and place as may be designated by resolution of the
4 board of trustees as provided in the by-laws. Notice there-
5 of, signed by the chairman or clerk of the board, shall be
6 conspicuously posted in two public places within the dis-
7 trict, not less than seven days before the meeting. Special
8 meetings may be called by the board in like manner at any
9 time, and notice of special meetings shall state the business
10 to be transacted thereat. Eleven persons qualified to vote
11 in such meetings shall constitute a quorum. If for any
12 reason an annual meeting is not held on the above date, a
13 meeting in lieu thereof may be called in like manner to be
14 held within three months from said date.

All persons resident in said district and qualified to vote
2 for governor under the laws of this state shall be entitled
3 to vote in any meeting of the district, including the meeting
4 for acceptance of this charter.'
