STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, for the Purchase of One Hundred Copies of the
History of the Town of Lincoln.

Resolved: That the state librarian be authorized to purchase one hundred copies of the History of the Town of Lincoln, by the late Dr. Dana Fellows, at a price not exceeding five dollars per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian, and that there be and hereby is appropriated for this purpose the sum of five hundred dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This book of three hundred and eighty pages is divided into two parts, historical and genealogical. It covers the history of an old town situated on the Penobscot river, abounding in human interest and romance, and about which no history has ever been published. The genealogy is particularly well carried out, the index being arranged so that family connections can readily be traced.

Dr. Fellows was one of the older residents of Lincoln, having been born in this town, and spent a large amount of time in getting together the material which makes the history authentic as well as readable. Especially did he make exhaustive search of early original records, and the results should be preserved in printed form.
