STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to Examination Papers of Applicants for
Admission to the Bar.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-eight of chapter eighty-four of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the whole of said
3 section and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 28. The examination papers shall be kept on file
2 in the office of the secretary of the board, for a period of
3 one year, after which time the same may be destroyed, and
4 a record kept of each application, the name of the appli-
5 cant, and his qualifications and general standing as ascer-
6 tained by such examination, and the secretary of the board

7 shall furnish each applicant with a card, showing the pro-
8 ficiency he has attained in each branch or subject upon
9 which he has been examined, whether a certificate is issued
10 or not. Any applicant failing to pass the examination may
11 again apply after six months, by showing to the board that
12 he has diligently pursued the study of the law six months
13 prior to the examination; if such second application is with-
14 in one year after his first examination, he shall not be re-
15 quired to pay an extra fee for the second examination.'
