STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Prohibiting Business and Recreation on Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five of chapter one hundred and twenty-six 2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out 3 all of said section and by substituting therefor the follow-4 ing section:

'Sect. 35. Whoever on Sunday keeps open or conducts 2 his place of business, or does any work or labor for hire; 3 conducts any sport, show, game or recreation; or is present 4 at any dancing, public diversion, show or entertainment, en5 couraging the same, shall be punished by a fine not exceed-

6 ing ten dollars; provided, however, that this section shall 7 not apply to work of necessity, to operating airplanes, rail-8 roads, steam or electric, steamships or ferry-boats; to the 9 driving of taxi cabs or public carriages; to printing and 10 selling Sunday newspapers; to the keeping open of hotels, 11 restaurants, garages, drug, tobacco or confectionery stores; 12 or to the selling of gasoline; to giving scientific, philosophi-13 cal, religious, or educational lectures; to conducting or tak-14 ing part in musical concerts. And provided also, that this 15 section shall not apply to amateur baseball games, golf, 16 hockey, track and other amateur sports, in cities or towns, 17 where such games and sports are permitted by vote of the 18 municipal officers of said cities and towns.'
