STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Magalloway Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or

kill any fish in any other way than in the ordinary way of

casting with artificial flies in the rivers and lakes extending

from Willow spring to the state of New Hampshire, in
cluding Lincoln and Lower Black ponds, and not more than

ten fish neighboring not more than three ponds shall be

taken in any one day in said waters nor shall any trout less

than eight inches in length nor any salmon less than twelve

inches in length be taken in any of said waters.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for, catch, take or

2 kill any fish in any ponds and tributaries of said Magallo-

3 way river and lakes including all Magalloway waters north-

4 erly of Willow Spring, except those hereinbefore mentioned.

Sect. 3. It shall be unlawful to fish for, catch, take or kill

2 any fish from September fifteenth to the first day of October

3 next following, on all stream waters at the point where the

4 original bank is well defined, with the exception of the Big

5 Magalloway at the head of Aziscoos Lake.
