STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Repeal a Resolve Providing for a State Pension
for Ivanilla Nute of Lewiston.

Resolved: That chapter one hundred ninety-four of the
2 resolves of nineteen hundred twenty-seven, providing for a
3 state pension for Ivanilla Nute of Lewiston, be, and hereby
4 is, repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The legislature of 1927 passed a resolve providing for a pension of \$8.00 per month for Ivanilla Nute. The reasons for the granting of this resolve were that Mrs. Nute had a mother dependent upon her, and because of the age and infirmity of her mother she was deprived of the opportunity of following work.

Inside of a few months after the passage of the resolve, Mrs. Nute married a Spanish war veteran, who receives a government pension; her mother received a government pension and a state pension, and her government pension was increased in 1928. Her mother has recently died and the state has paid her burial expenses.

As the reasons for which the pension was granted do not any longer exist, there does not appear to be any reason why the pension should continue.
