STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for
Frank A. Choate of Montville.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month
2 be, and hereby is, granted to Frank A. Choate, of Mont-
3 ville, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for
4 soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension
5 shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and
6 continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and
7 shall be in lieu of the state pension which he is now receiv-
8 ing.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Frank A. Choate was granted a pension of four dollars per month by chapter sixty-five of the resolves of nineteen hundred twenty-three. He is the son of the late Albert Choate, who served in Company C, 19th Regiment of Maine Volunteers during the Civil War. His financial condition is very bad, and it is necessary that he should have additional help.
