STATE OF MAINE IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of Farmington Falls Electric Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. Farmington Falls Electric Light Company, a 2 corporation organized under the general laws of Maine, un-3 der the name, "The North Chesterville Light & Power Com-4 pany," by certificate recorded in the office of the secretary of 5 state, June twenty-first, nineteen hundred and thirteen, in 6 volume eighty, page four hundred and thirty-three, and by 7 certificate of change of name to "Farmington Falls Electric 8 Company" filed in the office of the secretary of state, October 9 fourteen, nineteen hundred and twenty, the purposes of HOUSE-No. 380

10 which are defined in its certificate of organization, is hereby 11 authorized to cancel said purposes and in place thereof to 12 substitute the following:

'The purposes of said corporation are the making, 2 generating, selling and supplying of electricity for lighting, 3 manufacturing and mechanical purposes in the counties of 4 Franklin, Kennebec, and Somerset, in the state of Maine, 5 wherever the same does not conflict or compete with exist-6 ing established electric light and power companies, when-7 ever authorized so to do by the public utilities commission 8 of Maine; the purchasing and owning of existing electric 9 light and power plants, lines and equipment and all other 10 real estate, personal property and water powers, necessary 11 or convenient for the purposes of said business; the issu-12 ing of bonds for the purposes of its business, subject to 13 the approval of the public utilities commission of Maine.

Sect. 2. Before this act shall take effect it shall be ac-2 cepted by vote of the stockholders representing a majority 3 of the outstanding stock of said corporation passed at a 4 meeting to be held for that purpose. Within thirty days 5 from the passage of such vote a copy thereof certified by 6 the clerk of the corporation shall be filed in the office of 7 the secretary of state who shall record such copy in the 8 book wherein certificates of organization of corporations 9 organized under the general law are recorded.'

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
