STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Permit the Closing of Public Offices in County
Buildings on Legal Holidays.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-two of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes, as amended by section three of chapter fifty of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, is hereby amended by adding to said section the following: 'and the public offices in county buildings may be closed to business on said days,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 52. No court shall be held on Sunday, or any day designated for the annual thanksgiving, or for the choice

3 of presidential electors, the nineteenth day of April, the
4 thirtieth day of May, the fourth day of July, the first Mon-
5 day of September, the day of the state election, Armistice
6 day, November eleventh, or on Christmas day; and when
7 the time fixed for a term of said court falls on either of
8 said days, it shall stand adjourned until the next day, which
9 shall be deemed the first day of the term for all purposes;
10 and the public offices in county buildings may be closed to
11 business on said days.'
