## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

## AN ACT Relative to the Salary of the Judge of the Ellsworth Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Section one of chapter two hundred ninety2 eight of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred
3 seventy-six, is hereby amended by striking out the third
4 sentence thereof, relative to the salary of the judge and
5 substituting thereof the following sentence: 'The salary of
6 the judge shall be one thousand dollars per year to be paid
7 out of the county treasury of the county of Hancock in

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8 equal monthly payments on the first day of each month,' 9 so that said section shall read as follows:

'Section I. The police court of the city of Ellsworth, in 2 the county of Hancock, shall be hereafter styled the Ells-3 worth municipal court. The present judge of said court 4 shall continue in office until the end of the term for which 5 he was elected. The salary of the judge shall be one thou-6 sand dollars per year to be paid out of the county treasury 7 of the county of Hancock in equal monthly payments on 8 the first day of each month.'

Sect. 2. The provisions of this act shall relate back to 2 April first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, so that the 3 increase in salary herein provided shall take effect as of 4 that date.
