STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Permitting Sunday Hunting in Unorganized Townships and Territories.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-three, chapter two hundred nineteen,

public laws, nineteen hundred seventeen, as amended, is

hereby further amended by inserting after the word "kind"

in the third line of said section the words 'except in un
organized townships and territories,' and by inserting after

the word "Sunday" in the fourth line of said section the

words 'except in unorganized townships and territories,' so

that said section, when amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 73. Sunday is a closed season, on which it is not

2 lawful to hunt, kill or destroy any wild animals or wild 3 birds of any kind, except in unorganized townships and 4 territories. Whoever hunts, kills, or destroys any wild ani5 mal or wild bird on Sunday, except in unorganized town6 ships and territories, shall pay a fine of not less than ten,
7 nor more than forty dollars and costs for each offense;
8 provided, however, that if protected wild animals or wild
9 birds are hunted, killed, destroyed or had in possession in
10 violation of this section, the penalty shall be the same as
11 is now imposed therefor during other closed season; but
12 the penalties imposed for the violation of the Sunday laws
13 of the statutes of this state are not hereby repealed or
14 diminished.'
