STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Certain Reports to the Commissioner of Labor and Industry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifteen of chapter forty-nine is hereby amend-2 ed by adding to the end of said section the following: 'The

3 provisions of this section shall not apply to persons, firms

4 or corporations obliged by law to report such deaths, acci-

5 dents and injuries to the Maine Industrial Accident Com-

6 mission,' so that said section as amended shall read as fol-

7 lows:

'Sect. 15. The person in charge of any factory, work-2 shop or other industrial establishment shall within ten days

3 after the occurrence, report in writing to the commissioner 4 of labor and industry all deaths, accidents, or serious phy-5 sical injuries sustained by any person therein or on the 6 premises, stating as fully as possible the cause of the death 7 or the extent and cause of the injury, and the place where 8 the injured person has been sent, with such other or fur-9 ther information relative thereto as may be required by 10 said commissioner, who may investigate the causes thereof 11 and require such precautions to be taken as will prevent 12 the recurrence of similar happenings. No statement con-13 tained in any such report shall be admissible in evidence 14 in any action arising out of the death or accident therein 15 reported. The term "serious physical injuries," as used in 16 this section, shall be construed to mean every accident which 17 results in the death of the employee or causes his absence 18 from work for at least six days thereafter. The provisions 19 of this section shall not apply to persons, firms or corpora-20 tions obliged by law to report such deaths, accidents and 21 injuries to the Maine Industrial Accident Commission.'
