STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Rosie E. Clark
of Etna.

Resolved: That a pension of fifteen dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Rosie E. Clark of Etna to be paid
3 quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their
4 dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen
5 hundred and twenty-nine, and continue until otherwise pro-
6 vided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Rosie E. Clark is the daughter of Henry W. Shaw, who served in Company C, 13th Maine Infantry, also as a veteran volunteer, during the Civil War. He enlisted October 25, 1861, and became a veteran volunteer February 1, 1864; he died on February 8, 1923.

Rosie E. Clark is 61 years of age. She has no income and no property, except a half interest in a small place, valued at \$1500, on which there is a claim of \$700. She derives no income from this property. She is an invalid and has to get around on crutches, and is unable to do any work. She must become a town charge unless relief is given in the form of aid from the state on the ground that she is the daughter of a Civil war veteran.
