### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Jennie S. Sutton of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of fifteen dollars per month be, 2 and hereby is, granted to Jennie S. Sutton of Lewiston, to 3 be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers 4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, 5 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and continue until other-6 wise provided by the legislature.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Jennie S. Sutton is the daughter of George W. Patrick who served in Company F, 5th Maine Volunteers, during the Civil War. She is seventy-three years of age, and in very bad physical condition, and needs more aid than can be given her under the general law.
