STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Defining the Crime of Burglary with Explosives and
Providing the Punishment Therefor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any person who, with intent to commit crime, breaks, and
2 enters, either by day or by night, any building, whether
3 inhabited or not, and opens or attempts to open any vault,
4 safe or other secure place by the use of nitroglycerine, dyna-
5 mite, gunpowder or any other explosive, shall be deemed
6 guilty of burglary with explosives.

Any person duly convicted of burglary with explosives
2 shall be punished by imprisonment for a term of not less
3 than twenty nor more than forty years.
