STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Close the Tacoma Chain of Lakes to Ice Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish through the ice, at
2 any time, for any kind of fish in the Tacoma chain of lakes,
3 being Jimmy, Buker, Sand, Woodbury and Purgatory ponds,
4 situated in the towns of Litchfield and Monmouth, in the
5 county of Kennebec.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates the provision of this act shall 2 pay a fine of not less than ten, nor more than thirty dollars, 3 and costs of prosecution, for each offense; and in addition 4 thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had 5 in possession in violation of any provision of said section.
