STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Bowling-Alleys.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter thirty-two of the revised statutes
2 is hereby amended by striking out the whole of said sec-
3 tion and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 3. Whoever, for the sake of gain, profit or hire,
2 shall maintain, keep, manage or operate directly or indirect-
3 ly any club room wherein minors are allowed to play pool,
4 billiards, bagatelle or cards, or whoever operates any shoot-
5 ing gallery in connection with said club room shall obtain
6 annually from the municipal officers of the town in which
7 the club is located a license to maintain and operate the

8 same, which may be revoked at any time with or without
9 cause; whoever violates the provisions hereof forfeits not
10 less than ten dollars for each day that said club room is
11 maintained, kept, managed or operated without a license
12 and in default of payment of such fine shall be imprisoned
13 not less than thirty days.'
