STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to State Juvenile Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred forty-four of the re-
2 vised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
3 "one woman" in the sixth line of said section and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the words 'two women,' so that said
5 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Trustees, appointment and tenure. R. S. c.
2 144, sect. 1. The government of the state school for boys,
3 established in the city of South Portland, in the county of

4 Cumberland, for the instruction, employment and reform
5 of juvenile offenders, and of the state school for girls, es-
6 tablished in Hallowell, in the county of Kennebec, for the
7 education, employment and reform of girls, is vested in a
8 board of trustees, consisting of five men and two women,
9 inhabitants of the state, who shall be known as "trustees
10 of juvenile institutions." The governor, with the advice
11 and consent of the council, shall annually appoint a mem-
12 ber of said board to hold office for a term of six years.
13 Any vacancy occurring during a term shall be filled in like
14 manner for the remainder of the unexpired term. Any
15 trustee may be removed at any time by the governor and
16 council, for cause.'
