STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Regarding Registration and Licensing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-seven of chapter two hundred eleven of
2 the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one is hereby
3 amended by striking out the whole of said section and in-
4 serting in place thereof the following, so that said section,
5 as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 27. The secretary shall appoint as deputies or
2 agents, the clerks of each city or town of one thousand
3 inhabitants or more (determined by the 1920 United States
4 census and by each United States census hereafter) to re-
5 ceive applications for registrations and licenses and issue

6 the same as hereinafter provided. The secretary may also
7 appoint deputies or agents in convenient places in the state
8 to receive applications for registrations and licenses and
9 to conduct examinations when ordered by the secretary.
10 Inspectors may be delegated to act as such deputies or
11 agents. The town and city clerks shall accept the duties
12 and give bonds to an amount satisfactory to the secretary
13 for the faithful performance of their duties. They shall
14 transmit all fees, applications and duplicates of registration
15 to the secretary within forty-eight hours after they have
16 been received, but they may deposit the fees at the direction
17 of the secretary. The clerks shall receive fifteen cents from
18 the applicant for each registration issued and ten cents for
19 each operator's license issued and the oath shall be without
20 charge if given by the clerk. The secretary may withhold
21 the issuing of any class of registration from any clerk which
22 may be deemed expedient. Any clerk acting as deputy or
23 agent of the secretary under this act can by special authority
24 from the secretary act in any capacity which the secretary
25 has authority to delegate. The secretary shall supply the
26 clerks with plates and blanks as in his judgment they will
27 require and make rules to make workable and safe this act.
28 This act shall take effect January first, nineteen hundred
29 thirty.'
