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## STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

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AN ACT to Increase the Time in Which to Appeal From  
Municipal and Police Courts, Trial Justices.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eighteen of chapter eighty-eight of the revised  
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words  
3 "twenty-four hours" and inserting the words 'five days' so  
4 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 18. *Appeal, when and how claimed; its effect.*

2 Any party aggrieved by the judgment of the justice, may  
3 appeal to the next supreme judicial or superior court in the  
4 same county, and may enter such appeal at any time within

5 five days after the judgment, Sunday not included; and in  
6 that case no execution shall issue, and the case shall be en-  
7 tered and determined in the appellate court.'
