STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Alice M.

Whitten of Albion.

Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month
2 be, and hereby is, granted to Alice M. Whitten of Albion,
3 to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred twenty-nine, and continue until other-
6 wise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Alice M. Whitten is the widow of Richard Whitten, who served in Company C, 19th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. She is 73 years of age and a confirmed invalid, requiring constant care and attention. Her Government pension of \$30.00 per month and the \$12.00 per month which she has been receiving as State aid under the general law are not sufficient for her support.
