STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Charles R. Fish of Belfast.

Resolved: That a pension of fifteen dollars per month be, 2 and hereby is, granted to Charles R. Fish of Belfast, to be 3 paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and 4 their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first nine-5 teen hundred and twenty-nine, and continue until otherwise 6 provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Charles R. Fish is the son of Elisha C. Fish who served in Company G, 24th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. Mr. Fish is a cripple and his general health is very poor. One of his legs is 7 inches shorter than the other, and his eyesight is very poor. He is unable to earn anything for his own support. He receives a Government pension of \$20 per month by Special Act of Congress, and has been receiving \$10 per month as State Aid under the general law, but these amounts are not sufficient for his support.
