STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Regulating the Supervision of Public Dances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any person conducting and maintaining any
2 dance hall or place of amusement where dancing is per-
3 mitted, who shall suffer or permit said dance hall or place
4 of amusement where dancing is permitted to be frequented
5 by noisy and disorderly persons or permit in said dance
6 hall or place of amusement where dancing is permitted any
7 indecent or immoral conduct, shall be guilty of a misde-
8 meanor, and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine
9 of not more than one hundred dollars.

Sect. 2. Upon a second or subsequent conviction, the
2 court may in addition to said fine, prohibit the person con-
3 victed of said offence, from further conducting and main-
4 taining any dance hall or place of amusement where danc-
5 ing is permitted for a period of six months thereafter,
6 except under the supervision of an officer of the law who
7 shall be in attendance at said dance hall or place of amuse-
8 ment where dancing is permitted at all times during the
9 dance and whose fees for said attendance shall be paid
10 by the person charged with said order of court.
