STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Bucksport Seminary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section three of chapter four hundred thirteen
2 of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-
3 three as amended by chapter two of the private and special
4 laws of nineteen hundred twenty-five is hereby further
5 amended so as to read as follows:

‘Sect. 3. The whole number of the board of trustees of
2 the East Maine Conference Seminary, commonly known as
3 the Bucksport Seminary, shall not at any time exceed thirty-
4 nine. The headmaster shall be ex-officio one of the num-
5 ber. The Maine Conference of the Methodist Episcopal

6 church shall have the right to elect not more than fifteen
7 trustees. The trustees may have the right to elect not
8 more than twenty-three trustees, fifteen of whom shall be
9 nominated by the trustees and eight of whom may be nomi-
10 nated by the headmaster. The election shall in all cases
11 be by ballot, provided, that at all times two-thirds of the
12 trustees, and the headmaster and a majority of the faculty
13 shall be members of the Methodist Episcopal church.'

Sect. 2. Section five of chapter four hundred thirteen of
2 the private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-
3 three as amended by chapter two of the private and special
4 laws of nineteen hundred twenty-five is hereby further
5 amended so that said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 5. And be it further enacted that thirteen trustees
2 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business;
3 and the concurring vote of at least two-thirds of the trus-
4 tees present shall be necessary for the sale of real estate,
5 provided, however, that the sale of any real estate the con-
6 sideration for which does not exceed five hundred dollars,
7 may be authorized by the executive committee of said
8 seminary; provided further that where the sale of real es-
9 tate is contemplated such purpose shall be indicated in the
10 call.'
