STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, for the Purchase of One Hundred Copies of
"The Beginnings of Education in Maine."

Resolved: That the state librarian be authorized to purchase one hundred copies of "The Beginnings of Education in Maine," by Ava H. Chadbourne, at the price of one dollar and fifty cents per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian, and that there be and hereby is appropriated for this purpose the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This history is an analysis of the economic, social, political and religious conditions in the District of Maine from the time of the first authentic records of explorers upon its coast in 1602 until 1820 when it became a state, and the resulting educational tendencies in elementary and secondary schools. The study is based upon the opinions of the historians of the colonial period in America, with special emphasis upon the authority of the historians of the District of Maine, the records of the two hundred and thirty-six towns incorporated in the District before 1820, local histories of these towns, the trustees' records of the twenty-five academies established in this period and the current periodicals of that time which are available today.

The book will contain about one hundred and forty pages.
