**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE**

---

AN ACT to Increase the Salaries of the Judge and the  
Recorder of the Bangor Municipal Court.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter two hundred and eleven of the  
2 private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-  
3 five, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out  
4 the words "twenty-one hundred" and "eighteen hundred and  
5 fifty" in the eighth line thereof and inserting in the place  
6 thereof the words 'twenty-three hundred' and 'twenty-one  
7 hundred,' so that said section as amended shall read as  
8 follows:

‘Sect. 11. Said court shall be held at such places as the  
2 city of Bangor shall provide and said city shall have power  
3 and it shall be its duty to raise money and provide a proper  
4 place for said court and its officers and suitably furnish,  
5 warm and light the same, for which there shall be paid  
6 from the county of Penobscot as rental in quarterly pay-  
7 ments, the sum of one thousand dollars annually. The sala-  
8 ries of the judge and clerk thereof which are hereby fixed  
9 at twenty-three hundred dollars and twenty-one hundred  
10 dollars respectively, to be paid quarterly with all other ex-  
11 penses of said court, shall be paid from the treasury of the  
12 county of Penobscot and in addition thereof there shall  
13 be provided the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars a  
14 year for clerk hire, to be paid monthly from said treasury,  
15 provided however that the county commissioners of said  
16 county may in their discretion, expend a larger amount not  
17 exceeding five hundred dollars per year, for the employment  
18 of extra clerks.’
