IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Set Off Certain Land from the Town of Hudson
to be Annexed to the City of Old Town.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All that part of the town of Hudson in Penob-
2 scot county which is bounded and described as follows:
3 Beginning at a stone monument standing on the easterly
4 shore of Pushaw pond and in the south line of said Hud-
5 son; thence south eighty-three degrees, fifty minutes east
6 of said south line of Hudson eighty-six rods twenty-one
7 links from said pond to a stone monument marking the
8 southeast corner of said town of Hudson; thence northerly
9 on the east line of Hudson two hundred two rods to the

10 outlet of Pushaw pond; thence westerly along the southerly
11 shore of said outlet to Pushaw pond; thence westerly, south-
12 erly and southeasterly along easterly shore of Pushaw pond
13 to the bound begun at, containing two hundred acres more
14 or less, together with the inhabitants thereof, is hereby set
15 off from the town of Hudson and annexed to the city of
16 Old Town is hereby vested with all powers and privileges
17 and subject to all the duties and obligations attending the
18 annexation of the above described land.

Sect. 2. The several inhabitants and all resident and non-
2 resident owners of the land hereinabove described shall be
3 holden to pay all taxes which have been legally assessed
4 upon them by the town of Hudson for the year nineteen
5 hundred and twenty-eight, the collector of taxes for the
6 town of Hudson is hereby authorized and required to col-
7 lect and pay all taxes to him committed for the year nine-
8 teen hundred and twenty-eight according to his respective
9 warrants. This act so far as it relates to the setting off
10 of the above described land shall not take effect unless
11 accepted and approved by a majority vote of the legal voters
12 within said town of Hudson at the annual town meeting
13 to be held in nineteen hundred and thirty. The town clerk
14 shall reduce the subject of this act to the following ques-
15 tion: "Shall the act to set off the following described land
16 situated in the town of Hudson, to the city of Old Town,
17 to wit, all that part of the town of Hudson in Penobscot
18 county which is bounded and described as follows: Begin-

19 ning at a stone monument standing on the easterly shore
20 of Pushaw pond and in the south line of said Hudson;
21 thence south eighty-three degrees, fifty minutes east of said
22 south line of Hudson eighty-six rods twenty-one links from
23 said pond to a stone monument marking the southeast cor-
24 ner of said town of Hudson; thence northerly on the east
25 line of Hudson two hundred two rods to the outlet of
26 Pushaw pond; thence westerly along the southerly shore
27 of said outlet to Pushaw Pond; thence westerly, southerly
28 and southeasterly along easterly shore of Pushaw pond to
29 the bound begun at, containing two hundred acres more or
30 less, be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by an X
31 placed against the words "Yes" or "No." The result shall
32 be declared by the selectmen and due certificate thereof filed
33 by the town clerk with the secretary of state.
