RESOLVE, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for the General Care, Maintenance, and Education Thereof.

---

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from  
2 the state treasury to be expended, under the direction of  
3 the governor and council, by the agent of the Penobscot  
4 tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe, for the year  
5 from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, to June  
6 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty, and for the year  
7 from July first, nineteen hundred and thirty, to June thir-  
8 tieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-one as follows:

Amounting to thirty thousand, nine hundred eighty-five

2 dollars and fifty-five cents, for the year from July first,  
3 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine to June thirtieth, nine-  
4 teen hundred and thirty; and twenty-nine thousand, nine  
5 hundred eighty-five dollars and fifty-five cents, for the year  
6 from the first of July, nineteen hundred and thirty to June  
7 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of  
2 the sub-divisions above named and not required for the  
3 purpose, may, upon recommendation of the state auditor,  
4 be transferred by the governor and council to pay bills  
5 against any of the above sub-divisions, where bills may  
6 have been contracted in excess of the amount above set  
7 forth.
