STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes as Amended, Relative to Department of Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of
2 the revised statutes as amended by chapter one hundred
3 and seventy-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred
4 and seventeen as amended by chapters one hundred and
5 forty-seven and two hundred and fifteen of the public laws
6 of nineteen hundred and nineteen as amended by chapter
7 one hundred and ninety-four of the public laws of nineteen
8 hundred and twenty-one is amended by striking out in the

9 fifth and sixth lines of said section as amended the words
10 "as may be authorized by law," so that said section as
11 amended shall read as follows :

'Sect. 23. *Department of education.* The state superin-
2 tendent of public schools shall receive an annual salary of
3 five thousand dollars. He shall also receive his actual cash
4 expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties,
5 which shall be paid out of such funds as may be provided
6 for that purpose. He shall appoint a deputy and shall em-
7 ploy such agents and such clerical assistance as he may
8 deem necessary and as may be approved by the governor
9 and council for carrying on the work of his office. The
10 deputy state superintendent of public schools and the agents
11 employed by the state superintendent in accordance with
12 the provisions of this section shall receive such salaries as
13 the governor and council may approve within the appro-
14 priation made by the legislature and shall also receive their
15 necessary traveling expenses incurred in the performance
16 of their official duties.'
