SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to Senate Paper Number Five Hundred and Forty-one, "An Act to Provide for Building a Bridge Across the Penobscot River, at or Near Bucksport, to Be Known as the Waldo-Hancock Bridge."

Amend section two by inserting in the eleventh line after 2 the word "million" the words 'two hundred thousand,' also 3 by striking out in the twelfth and thirteenth lines the words 4 "if necessary, said bridge shall contain such draw as shall 5 be satisfactory to the United States war department," also 6 by striking out in the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth

7 lines the words "the railroad and other;" amend section 8 six by striking out in the third and fourth lines the words 9 "except that travelers on foot shall be allowed to cross said 10 bridge free from the payment of toll," also by striking out 11 in the sixth line the words "(other than foot passengers)," 12 also by striking out in the eleventh line the words "(ex-13 clusive of foot passengers);" and amend section eight by 14 striking out in the first line the words "to congress" and 15 inserting in place thereof the words 'for federal aid.'
