STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of H. H. Havey and Estate of Bradbury Smith for Reimbursement for Loss on State Highway Contract.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000) to be paid to H. H. 3 Havey and estate of Bradbury Smith to reimburse the said 4 H. H. Havey and estate of Bradbury Smith for loss on 5 state highway construction. Said sum to be paid from 6 state highway funds.

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STATEMENT OF FACTS

In 1916 Bradbury Smith and H. H. Havey both of Sullivan, Maine, contracted with the State Highway Commission to construct a certain section of state highway, known as the Gardiner-Richmond section, located four and one-half miles in the city of Gardiner and one-half mile in the town of Richmond, for the sum of twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000.) Construction was commenced in July 1916 and continued with slight interruption during the winter months, until the job was fully completed in January 1918. The total costs of construction to the contractors was \$47,654.70, thereby making a loss of \$19,654.70.

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
