**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE**

AN ACT Requiring Teachers and Janitors to File a Health
Certificate.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall enter upon the duties of a
2 teacher or janitor in any public school unless and until he
3 shall have filed a certificate from a licensed and practicing
4 physician of this state certifying that such person is free
5 from all infectious and communicable diseases.

Sect. 2. A similar certificate shall be filed by such teacher
2 or janitor at the commencement of each school year there-
3 after, if he then continues as teacher or janitor, or if not so
4 continuing, then immediately prior to a subsequent entering
5 upon the duties of a teacher or janitor.

Sect. 3. Such certificate shall be filed with the superin-
2 tending school committee and there kept as a record and
3 shall be available to inspection at all reasonable times.

Sect. 4. If such teacher or janitor fails to file such cer-
2 tificate, as aforesaid, or files one which is false, the salary
3 or compensation which he would receive shall not be paid
4 for the period of such failure.

Sect. 5. All acts, parts of acts, inconsistent herewith are
2 hereby repealed.
