# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the State Board of Mothers' Aid.

Whereas, the funds appropriated by the legislature for carrying on the work of the state board of Mothers' Aid are insufficient to continue the present number of active cases for the remaining months of the fiscal year to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine; and

Whereas, the state board of Mothers' Aid, in an endeavor to care for as many mothers with dependent children as the appropriation would permit, has carried an excess liability on the annual appropriation, which means it will be necessary to suspend all active cases for a period of five weeks in order to live within the appropriation available; and

Whereas, the aforesaid facts seem to this legislature to con-

stitute an emergency to protect the welfare of the recipients of Mothers' Aid;

Now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the governor and council are hereby auth2 orized to provide such amounts of money as they may deem
3 necessary to carry out the activities of the board of Moth4 ers' Aid for the balance of the year ending June thirtieth
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, from funds under the
6 control of the governor and council now in their possession.
