STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Aid in the Screening of
the Outlet of Lower Wilson Pond, in the Town of Greenville,
in the County of Piscataquis.

Resolved: That the sum of eight hundred (\$800.00)
2 dollars be and hereby is appropriated, to be taken from
3 the appropriation for the maintenance of the department
4 of inland fisheries and game, to be expended by the com-
5 missioner of inland fisheries and game, to aid in screening
6 the outlet of Lower Wilson pond, in Piscataquis county.
7 Provided, however, that said appropriation for the erection
8 of said screen shall not be available until some responsible

9 corporation or incorporated fish and game club, or the town
10 in which said outlet is located, or some other town in the
11 county of Piscataquis, in which said waters are situated,
12 shall have in legal town meeting, and having an article in
13 the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by
14 vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping
15 of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all
16 debris so that the same will not become clogged and prevent
17 the free running of water through the same. And pro-
18 vided, further, that said appropriation shall not be available
19 until the citizens of the county in which said pond is situ-
20 ated shall have paid into the state treasury the balance found
21 necessary by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game
22 to erect said screen. And provided, further, that if the
23 actual cost of said screen provided for in this resolve is less
24 than the amount appropriated therefor, the state shall be
25 liable for only one-half of the cost of such screen. Any
26 part of said appropriation not expended in the year nineteen
27 hundred and twenty-nine shall be available during the year
28 nineteen hundred and thirty.
